Phonics


 The class teacher will record her phonics session and put on class dojo

- The power point will explain how phonics helps children learn to read and write.

- No sweets, crisps etc. are allowed at play time.

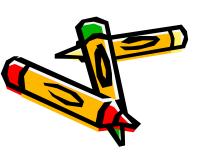
Universal Free School Meals

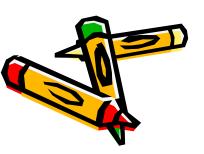
School Dinners

- If you prefer you may provide a packed lunch, but no chocolate or sweets, chocolate biscuits such as kit-kat are allowed.



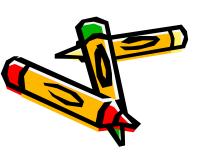
Nut allergies.

- This is to ensure the safety of children and adults in school with nut allergies.




Using cutlery!

- Please help your child become more independent in cutting up their own foodthere are a few weeks left to practise before September!



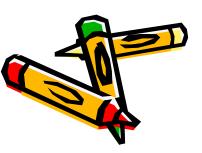
Independence

- Staff have been busy promoting independence during nursery.
- Children need to be able to dress themselves, put their coat on and do up the zip!
- If they say 'I can't do it' add the word 'yet'- practise makes perfect - just don't give up!



PE





- In September the class teacher will let you know which 2 days she will be doing P.E on.
 - Make sure your child has 'easy' clothes on when it is a PE day.
 - Children need black shorts and a white t-shirt for PE. These can be kept on your child's peg and taken home each half term for washing.
 - During summer months a pair of pumps/trainers will be needed for outdoor PE.
- All articles of clothing should be clearly labelled with your child's name.



- The school has a 'no jewellery' policy. Please support us and adhere to this.
- Parents are asked to help school to establish this policy by not sending children to school in earrings, necklaces, chains etc. This is for health and safety reasons and the school will not take responsibility for any jewellery in school.
- If you want your child to have their ears pierced we suggest you do it at the beginning of the Summer holiday so that they can be removed for school, plasters onto of earrings is not allowed.


Uniform

- As parents you will be asked to sign a Home School Agreement at the parent conference in September.





Home Activities

- Children will bring home words to learn to read and spell, as well as a reading book daily. Please find time each evening to listen to your child read and learn their keywords and spellings. Little and often is best.
- Parents are expected to write in their child's homeschool book every time they listen to him/her read. This is a vital part of the home school partnership. Make sure you child's book bag, containing their reading book, home-school book, keywords and spellings, is brought to school each day.
- Home learning activities will be sent home on Fridays. This may include an activity related to your child's learning journey.
