Write a story about an African adventure. (Maybe you get lost on safari, or you are hunting for long lost African treasure like Indiana Jones)	Create a mini greenhouse - use a clean drinks bottle. Cut it in half and plant some seeds in soil. Cello tape the top half back onto the bottom half and leave in a sunny place.	Create a video explaining anything you have learned from this topic or are interested in.
Create a holiday brochure/poster persuading people to visit Africa	Grow a potato - Fill a jar with water; stick tooth picks in the centre of the potato and leave in a sunny place. Only allow the bottom of the potato to sit in the water and see what happens.	Research, cook and eat a traditional African meal/dish. Remember to take some photos.
Write a fact file about an African country or animal.	Create a new insect and create a fact file for it including it's life cycle.	Make an African drum.
Find the 10 similarities and differences between Africa and England.	Create a life cycle of a turtle	Draw or paint an African Flag.
