On 4 January 2021 the government announced a National lockdown and instructed schools to close for most pupils.

Schools COVID-19 operational guidance - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

The Main points from this updated guidance are as follows

- On 19 July the government informed schools that at Step 4 we will no longer recommend that it is necessary to keep children in consistent groups ('bubbles').
- As well as enabling flexibility in curriculum delivery, this means that assemblies can resume, and you no longer need to make alternative arrangements to avoid mixing at lunch.
- Settings will only need to do contact tracing up to Step 4. From Step 4, close contacts will be identified via NHS Test and Trace and education settings will no longer be expected to undertake contact tracing.
- From 16 August 2021, children under the age of 18 years old will no longer be required to self-isolate if they are contacted by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case.





- You should put in place and maintain an appropriate cleaning schedule. This should include regular cleaning of areas and equipment (for example, twice per day), with a particular focus on frequently touched surfaces.
- When your school is in operation, it is important to ensure it is well ventilated and that a comfortable teaching environment is maintained. You should balance the need for increased ventilation while maintaining a comfortable temperature.
- If anyone in your school develops COVID-19 symptoms, however mild, you should send them home and they should follow public health advice. Staff and pupils with a positive LFD test result should self-isolate in line with the stay at home guidance. They will also need to get a free PCR test to check if they have COVID-19. Whilst awaiting the PCR result, the individual should continue to self-isolate. If the PCR test is taken within 2 days of the positive lateral flow test, and is negative, it overrides the self-test LFD test and the pupil can return to school, as long as the individual doesn't have COVID-19 symptoms.
- You should maintain your capacity to deliver high quality remote education for next academic year.

General Cleaning

- Increase in general cleaning services throughout the week
- Regular cleaning of areas and equipment with a focus on frequently touched surfaces
- The following guidance is used

- 'Deep clean' of the school prior to reopening
- Desks will be cleared at the end of the day to enable staff to wipe down areas and to thoroughly clean surfaces

Cleaning (school staff)

- Shared areas will be cleaned after use
- Doors will be propped open where possible to allow further ventilation
 All staff will carry out general cleaning duties (throughout the day in their designated area. Staff will wipe down surfaces and equipment throughout the day. Cleaning products will be available in all rooms, in locked cupboards

Ventilation

- Increased airflow throughout the school
- School will be well ventilated at all times when in operation
- Classroom windows and internal doors will be opened for airlow

Limiting interactions between adults/children and between groups

Medium

Social Distancing - general





- Where possible original 2m guidance to be applied throughout the school setting i.e. with children, visitors, colleagues,—related to the age of the children
- Signs to be displayed outside the school to indicate advice to maintain social distancing for parents, highlighting methods to drop off and collect children
- Staff in school will continue to adhere to social distancing, where possible.

Assemblies

These will be reinstated in the halls of both sites however numbers restricted and different times

- Foundation stage will have class assemblies in the Autumn Term
- Y1 and Y2 lower school
- Y3 and Y4 C5/6 upper school
- Y5 and Y6 C8/9/10 upper school

Year group specific controls

- Bubbles are no longer recommended. However, we will still use our best endeavours to reduce the number of children mixing
- Classes will be kept separate as much as possible to reduce further the number of children mixing.

Parents, visitors, etc. will be advised to observe social distancing guidelines and will be asked to wear a mask if needing to have a meeting/speak to staff. Staggered starts across both sites and entrance/exit points are used- Pitt Street, Hirst Gate and Doncaster Road. Timings distributed to all parents/carers. A member of the SLT will be at entrance of both sites each day

Lower school

Nursery children (F1)

- Groups will be in line with EYFS guidance
- Have a separate playground





• Entry and exit to the school site is at Hirst Gate entrance – Identified outdoor waiting areas for parent/carers are on lower site playground

F2 children (C1)

- Supported in the F2 classroom
- Have access to additional outdoor area
 Entry and exit to the school site is at Hirst Gate street entrance Identified outdoor waiting areas for parent/carers are at the mid point gate on lower site playground

Y1 (C2)

- Supported in the classroom and additional shared space room.
- Will have access to a designated area of the KS1 playground or field (rota system)
- Entry and exit to the school site is at Hirst Gate entrance Identified outdoor waiting areas for parent/carers are at the mid point gate on lower site playground

Y1/2 (C3)

- Supported in the classroom and additional shared space room.
- Will have access to a designated area of the KS1 playground or field (rota system)
- Entry and exit to the school site is at Pitt Street entrance Identified outdoor waiting areas for parent/carers are next to the at the C3 steps

Y2 (C4)

- Supported in the classroom and additional shared library space
- Will have access to a designated area of the KS1 playground or field (rota system)
- Entry and exit to the school site is at Pitt Street entrance Identified outdoor waiting areas for parent/carers are in nursery playground

<u>Upper school</u> Y3 (C5) Y3/4 (C6)

- Supported in the classroom and study
- Will have access to a designated area of the KS2 playground or field (rota system)





• Entry and exit to the school site is at Doncaster Road entrance – Identified outdoor waiting areas for parent/carers are in upper part of the playground. All classes identified coned areas for lining up

Y4/5/6 (C7,8,9)

- Supported in the classroom and library area
- Will have access to a designated area of the KS2 playground/field (rota system)
- Entry and exit to the school site is at Doncaster Road entrance Identified outdoor waiting areas for parent/carers are in upper part of the playground
- All classes identified coned areas for lining up

Timetable

- Outdoor learning will take place as much as possible
- Social emotional and mental Health (SEMH) will play an important role in the curriculum and timetabled daily for all groups

Other

- Additional toilets available using units
- Children will go to the toilet one after the other

Children displaying COVID symptoms

- Removal of the child to an unoccupied, well ventilated room.
- PPE (gloves, apron and face mask) will be readily available in this room if the supporting adult needs to remain with the child to support his/her wellbeing
- The child's parents/carers will be contacted to collect the child
- The child will remain in the room (if possible) until parents/carers arrive.
- If the child needs the toilet whilst waiting to be collected, the child should be allowed to do so, and then cleaned using standard cleaning equipment before being used by anyone else.
- A window will be opened to ventilate the room, if possible





- The child will be supported to the front offices/ designated waiting areas and taken home by the parent/carer
- The adult who has supported the child can remain in school, unless he/she starts to display symptoms. The adult should ensure he/she washes their hands thoroughly (see handwashing guidance)
- IF the child tests positive for coronavirus, close contacts will be identified via NHS Test and Trace and education settings will no longer be expected to undertake contact tracing. From 16 August 2021, children under the age of 18 years old will no longer be required to self-isolate if they are contacted by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case.

- Will go home straight away
