English Reading

Our key Text this half term is Dougal's Deep Sea Diary by Simon Bartram. Dougal loves to explore the underwater world and we will be discovering it with him through our visit ti The Deep, books and pictures.

We are continuing to develop our inference skills in story and search for hidden meanings. We are going to be reading a variety of stories all about the sea and these will be on display in our book corner. We are going to be using a variety of non-fiction texts about the ocean and its creatures to help us answer questions that we have generated ourselves.

English Writing

In writing we are going to be Writing deep sea diaries of our own and using our reading for in formation skills to help us create non-fiction books on Ocean creatures. We will be writing ocean adventure stories when we discover a mysterious bottle containing a map and some shark teeth! Writing for a real purpose will be a focus and we will be applying our writing skills to write about events in history.

Spelling and Grammar

Our spellings have really improved this year and this has been mainly due to us developing the skills of proof reading our work and making corrections. Our weekly spelling focus will be on identifying words we have misspelt and leaning them in class. We are going to be learning about the different meanings of homophones, apply the

skills of adding pre-fixes and suffixes and how these change the meaning of words.

Computing

Children will have the opportunity to create music on digital devices using a programme called Chrome Music Lab song maker.

<u>Maths</u>

Our final half term will be focusing on problem solving and reasoning skills. We will be applying all our number fluency of:

Addition and subtraction of two digit numbers Multiplication and division facts to solve reasoning and word problems.

Developing our knowledge of three digit numbers and place values un preparation for year three. We will be reading scales both marked and unmarked to find out 'How deep is the sea?' We will be applying our maths skills to help us create recipes using our own ingredients which we have grown in our allotment. In addition to this, we will be making sure we are really fluent with our multiplication facts and doubles and halves.
